CHILD MAY:

	<p>-Tell an adult</p>
	<p>-Act differently.</p>
	<p>- Not want to come to school.</p>
	<p>- Say they feel poorly.</p>


STAFF WILL:

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Listen to parents/carers concerns however small they may seem.
